Based on John 13:33; 14:18

Jesus' friends were delighted that God had given Jesus new life. But they remembered that he had said he was going back to his Father. We can read Jesus' message to them in John's gospel.

"I am going back to my Father who sent me. It is better for you if I go away. If I go I will be able to send someone else to help you - the Holy Spirit of truth. The Holy Spirit will teach you everything that I have learned from my Father. The Holy Spirit will help you to know how you are to live. now and in the future."

Based on Acts 2:1-4

In the second part of Luke's story, the book of the Acts of the Apostles, we hear the story of Pentecost.

After Jesus had gone back to his Father, his friends stayed together with Mary, Jesus' Mother.

Peter was there and James and John and all the others.

They missed Jesus very much.

They felt weary and lost.

They couldn't get up and get on with their lives.


They didn't know what to do.

Based on Luke 19: 1-10


