Maths

In our Maths No Problem lessons we will be we will be looking at converting different units of measurement, including length, mass and time. We will also read the temperature on a thermometer. We will then solve problems that involve the conversion of these different measures.

The next chapter focuses on area and perimeter. We will find the perimeter of different shapes using Scale Diagrams

We will then estimate and measure the area of

Shapes progressing from rectangles to compound shapes. These skills will then be used and applied to word problems.

We will then move onto understanding the volume of solids. We will find the capacity of cuboids, then we will convert units of volume (metric and imperial).

Finally, we will write numbers in their thousands in Roman numerals.



Science

In our science lessons this half term we will be studying the life cycles of mammals, amphibians, insects and birds.

We will also look at how plants reproduce sexually and asexually, and describe some processes of reproduction in animals.



Come and See

Within our topic of Freedom & responsibility we will consider how can rules bring freedom. We will consider our growing conscience, and discuss how to bring about forgiveness and reconciliation.

In the Universal Church topic of Stewardship, we will look at how to become proud stewards of creation? We will consider how humans harm or help the environment. This includes studying which countries and societies suffer the most due to global warming. We will consider the principles of Catholic Social Teaching and take inspiration from the gospels.

English

Our main text this half term is 'Double Act' by Jacqueline Wilson. This features identical twins: Ruby and Garnet, who are dealing with enormous changes to their family life. Inspired by this book, writing opportunities include how to script and produce a scene for 'Double Act'. To write a letter of persuasion, in role, to the head teacher of Marnock Heights, and to write diary entries from the different perspectives of the twins.

Non-fiction writing links to our topic on North America, where we will write an information leaflet on one of the six regions of the continent of North America.

In grammar and punctuation, we will revise, understand and use the terms: Modal verb, Relative pronoun, Relative clause, Parenthesis, Bracket, Dash, Cohesion, Ambiguity. Spelling involves revising all the words studied this year as well as using further prefixes and suffixes and understand the guidance for adding them.

In Guided Reading, we will recommend books that we have read to our peers, giving reasons for our choices.

We will also expand on how to draw inferences such as inferring characters' feelings, thoughts and motives from their actions, and justifying inferences with evidence.

Geography
