based on John 17:11-12, 20-23

based on Mark 14: 32-46

based on Mark 15: 1-15

based on Luke 23: 26-43

based on Mark 15:21-41

Then Jesus gave a loud cry and died.

When the centurion, who was standing opposite saw how he died he said, "This man really was the Son of God."

Some women were there watching from a distance. They were Mary of Magdala, Mary the Mother of the younger James and of Joseph, and Salome. They had followed Jesus and had helped him when he was in Galilee. Many other women were there who had come up to Jerusalem with him.
