

# How strong is your faith?

Many of us may have read of the atrocity which took place last Sunday in Burkina Faso. Many may have not, as it did not receive much coverage in this country. Last weekend, while we were celebrating Mass across our parish here in Widnes, gunmen opened fire on people who were gathering like us in their parish church. Fifteen parishioners were murdered.

The Vicar General of the Catholic Diocese of Dori has asked that we 'pray for the souls of those murdered, for the healing of the wounded and for the conversion of those who continue to sow death and desolation in that country'.

This is not an isolated incident, with attacks taking place on a regular basis in that country. Church goers murdered and their priests abducted.

Take a moment as you read this to not only pray, but to ask yourself if this happened in this country how would you feel about going to Mass next Sunday with your family and friends knowing that this could happen again? Is your faith strong enough for you to say my need to celebrate my faith and encounter the Mass and the sacraments overcomes my fear of what may happen as I bear witness for my belief?

Pope Francis said during the Angelus on St Stephens day 'Let us ask ourselves do I care about and pray for those who, in various parts of the world, still suffer and die for their faith today? Do I bear witness to the Gospel consistently, with gentleness and confidence?'

#### **Chrism Mass**

The Chrism Mass, which this year will take place on **Wednesday 27**th **March** at 7.30pm in the Metropolitan Cathedral is usually the largest annual gathering of archdiocesan clergy and faithful throughout the year. At the Mass, Archbishop Malcolm blesses the holy oils that are used throughout the archdiocese for celebrations of the sacraments in the next year. He does this in the presence of priests, deacons and lay faithful. Altar Servers are encouraged to attend and wear their albs and sit with other altar servers from across the Archdiocese.

A coach will be available to take St. Wilfrid's parishioners to the Chrism Mass. We shall leave outside St. Bede Church at 6pm and return around 9.30pm.
