## Autumn Term 1 – Lightning Speed



### Main Texts

### Maths

We will start the year learning to count in multiples of 25, 100 and 1000 in order to count larger numbers comprehensively. We will learn about place value to 4 digits and will link numbers in numerals and in words. We will compare numbers using language such as 'greater', 'smaller', 'less' and 'more', using the mathematical symbols  $<$ ,  $>$  and  $=$ . We will also learn about rounding numbers to the nearest 1000, 100 and 10 and applying this knowledge to approximate, total and find the difference. We will add and subtract with numbers up to 10 000, using the column method and also mental methods for addition and subtraction.

### Science

As part of our Lightning Speed topic, we will be looking at electricity and how some appliances run on electricity. We will build a working circuit and identify its components. We will also determine whether a circuit will work or not group conductors and insulators.

#### Vocabulary:

### English

During this half term we will be reading 'Cliffhanger' by Jacqueline Wilson.

This book will form the main focus and motivation our writing composition, grammar, reading and speaking and listening. Specifically, we will be writing letters, postcards and developing character descriptions. We will also write our own poetry.

Our focus for grammar will be based on mastering clear sentence structure, by identifying subject, verbs and using a wider range of conjunctions. Spelling patterns include the prefixes 'mis', 'un', 'in', 'dis' and 'auto' and words ending in 'sure'.

We will continue our guided reading sessions, where we will listen to and read a wide range of texts, allowing us to improve our fluency and expression, retrieve and record information and make inferences and justify predictions. Throughout our English lessons the we will develop our speaking and listening skills by articulating and justifying our opinions, speak audibly in Standard English, and gain, maintain and monitor the interest of listeners.
