Remote Learning Information for Parents 2020-2021

The Department for Education have asked schools to prepare for all pupils to return full-time from the start of the autumn term 2020. They have set out their expectations but this will be reviewed and updated regularly.

Included in the guidance is the requirement for contingency planning for remote learning in case of self-isolation of pupils or staff or local outbreaks.

At Our Lady's Pupils and parents will be able to access activities via the class page on the website which will reflect some of the learning taking place in class. The children will be able to complete the activities and use the VLP (Visual Learning Platform) to upload work and message staff in regard to their learning and any difficulties they have.

There will be a separate section on the class page dedicated to 'Home Learning' which will be updated weekly. The children will have the following activities to complete during their period of Remote Learning. This will start from 21st September.

Children with SEND will be provided with appropriate learning and concrete resource packs with instructions on how to use. Teachers will provide video links and tutorials.

In the event of a whole class bubble having to self- isolated for a period of two weeks there will be daily timetable of work for the children to access and parents will be able to contact the class teacher using the VLP (Visual Learning Platform) in regard to their learning and any difficulties they have.
