### Psalm Response

“My God, my God, why have you forsaken me”?

### Gospel Acclamation Verse

“Christ became for us obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross.

Therefore, God has highly exalted him and bestowed on him the name that is above every name”.

### General Absolution - another perspective.

Pope Saint Paul VI, Pope from 1963 to 1978, brought about many reforms in the Church in light of Vatican II. The most obvious reform was of the Mass. Another reform concerned the Sacrament of Penance (to give ‘confession’ its proper title). In 1973, Pope Paul approved three rites for the celebration of this sacrament. The first is the normative form (one priest and one penitent). The second is what we usually do in Advent and Lent, our reconciliation service (celebration of the word followed by individual confession offered by lots of priests). The third is General Absolution (hereafter ‘GA’). Pope Paul made it clear that GA is only valid in cases of imminent danger of death and/or when the number of penitents greatly outweighs the number of priests. No parish in the Archdiocese presently meets these conditions.

GA was and is offered in parishes, under various guises (‘General Absolution Service’ or ‘Mass of Reconciliation’) in the misguided but sincere hope that it might bring lots of people back to the Church. After around fifty years of GA, we can see that people have not returned to the Church; in fact, many more have left. Regardless of genuine altruism, the actual intention behind GA was never to make penance more convenient; rather, to provide God’s mercy in emergencies. Pope Saint John Paul II reminded us of this in his 2002 Apostolic Letter, *Misericordia Dei*, wherein he re-emphasised the strictly limited application of GA and made it clear that individual confession is the ordinary and necessary means of reconciliation. He described the “arbitrary” and routine use of GA as a cause of “serious harm to the spiritual life of the faithful and to the holiness of the Church.” Lacking the necessary conditions, GA achieves nothing. The love of God is not ‘general’. It is personal. An underappreciated aspect of confession is the reality of a relationship being restored. We all need to restore our relationship with God, time and time again. I try to go to confession once a month because I am a sinner. Please come back to confession and experience the forgiveness of God. I speak for myself and Father Mark when I say, we will not judge you, we will be kind. It’s not my mercy, it’s God’s, and I won’t get in the way.
