Reflection - During the first session of the second Vatican Council there was a great debate about the Sacred liturgy, the main thrust of the debate seemed to be about the use of vernacular languages instead of Latin, when suddenly the aged Bishop of Mostar in Yugoslavia stood up and put in a very long plea for the inclusion of the name of St. Joseph in the Canon of the Mass... he was nervous and repeated himself which prompted the Cardinal who was presiding at the debate to cut him off! At the end of the days debate the same cardinal brought the 'house down' by a loud invocation to St. Joseph at the end of the closing prayers... Within three days Pope St. John XXIII had ordered the insertion of the name of Joseph within the canon of the Mass. The Holy Father knew that the Bishop of Mostar had been put on trial by the Communists and sentenced to four years in a concentration camp. He and the other prisoners were then put on a train which was deliberately wrecked in an attempt to kill all on board. The Bishop survived, but both hips were broken. He was in poor health but had made a great effort to attend the council and speak up for St. Joseph.

Thanks be to God that Pope Francis also has a great devotion to St. Joseph and has had his name inserted into all the Eucharistic prayers, he also made this year the year of St. Joseph. Joseph says nothing at all really in the Gospels and yet his actions are what strike us as heroic and noble. He trusts his dreams in which he is told what God wants of him, which amounts to being the protector and spouse of Mary and the guardian of Jesus. I love to think of Joseph as someone who listens and acts silently, resolutely, and kindly on what he hears.

At Seminary we have been saying a prayer each day which Pope Francis has said at the end of morning prayer each day throughout his priestly life, I commend it to you.

'Glorious Patriarch St. Joseph, whose power makes the impossible possible. Come to my aid in these times of anguish and difficulty. Take under your protection the serious and troubling situations that I commend to you, that they may have a happy outcome, and since you can do everything with Jesus and Mary, show me that your goodness is as great as your power.'

I know that he will hear you and silently and kindly hold you close to Mary and Jesus.
