Reflection

A few years ago, I was lucky enough to spend some time in Peru attending a gathering of Dominican friars from around the world. During my time in South America, I stayed at the convent of Our Lady of the Rosary, popularly known as Santo Domingo, in Lima, the capital of Peru. It was in this convent that Saint Martin de Porres, whom the Church honours and remembers in the first week of November, spent his life as a Dominican lay brother.

St Martin is affectionately known as 'the Saint of the Broom' because he considered all work to be sacred, no matter how menial. He is an example of how the gifts of those who seem to count for little in the eyes of the world cannot be hidden from God.

In this sense, St Martin calls to mind the Gospel figure of Zacchaeus (Luke 19:1-10). St Martin was mocked for being an illegitimate son and of mixed race. Zacchaeus, too, didn't seem to amount to much in most people's eyes. He was not only short in stature but reviled as a tax collector - a "sell-out" to the Romans. But starting with nothing more than the desire to see Jesus, his life was transformed. Within a few hours, Zacchaeus went from being scorned as an outcast to being blessed by Jesus as a son of Abraham. That's what the grace of God can do!

O Saint Martin, teach us to be generous with the gifts that God has given us. Make us sympathetic towards those who are suffering and afflicted. Pray to Our Redeemer and to Our Lady of Mercy that our hearts may not be hardened by sin and selfishness, but that we may always be kind and generous to our neighbours because they are the children of Our Heavenly Father. Amen.

Exciting news about the churches of St Bede and St Michael.

We are all aware that our two listed buildings, the church of St Bede and the church of St Michael, have been in need of repair and restoration work for some time.

As both of the buildings are listed any work requires the agreement of the Historic Churches Commission together with financial approval from the Archdiocesan Trustees. In addition, consultation is needed with the Arts and Architecture Group and of course parishioners will be kept informed of progress throughout.

Parishioners should be reassured that during this project normal repair and maintenance work will continue to take place at the churches of St Basil and St John Fisher.

A start has now been made on this process. An ambitious plan for the repair and restoration of our two buildings is to commence with immediate effect. Due to the size and nature of this project a plan will be drawn up for approval for St Bede's and once this is completed similar work will be carried out at St Michael's.

Approval with be sought for the following repairs and renovation:

The sandstone fabric of the church, roof, gutters and downspouts, lighting, windows and frames (including the stainedglass windows), tiled flooring, plastering, redecoration, heating system.

Some work will commence immediately at St Bede's. This includes the restoration of the now repaired weathervane to the church tower, the installation of a disabled toilet and baby changing facilities and repair work to the church bell.

It is an ambitious plan but one which needs to be started now to ensure the future of these two buildings and to make them both fit for purposes.

Updates on the progress will be published in the newsletter over the coming weeks and months.
