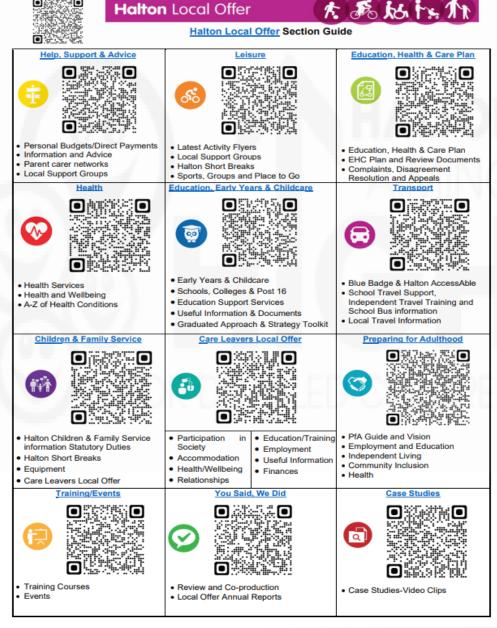

Therapy Space

The Therapy Space is a versatile room which is used by our therapists who provide Occupational Therapy and Sensory Integration assessments and intervention. It meets fidelity, which means it can be used to deliver Sensory Integration Therapy.



A sensory assessment identifies a person's sensory processing strengths and challenges, ultimately informing goals, interventions and strategies to enhance their daily functioning and well-being.

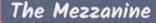

The Sensory Gym is a multi-sensory space designed for various abilities and ages, including adults. It supports sensory system

development and promotes skills such as balance, coordination, and praxis.

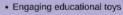


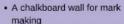
Located above the Sensory Gym, the Mezzanine level is a space for all ages to play and

environments, safely replicating real-life settings. It features gesture controls for customisable soothing or invigorating atmospheres.

This beautiful space includes:

- · Interactive surfaces with added scents, wind, and effects
- Adjustable lighting and sound to adapt levels of alertness and visual processing
- · Sensory toys like fibre optics, bubble tube, scarf blower and infinity mirror
- · Specialised equipment: a therapy chair for accessibility and vibrating mat

About the programme

The programme is for parents or carers of children aged 0 to 5 years old. It is free to join.

Everyone wants the best for their children, but with so much conflicting advice it can be hard to know what to do for the best as a parent, especially in the early years.



The HENRY Healthy Families: Right from the Start programme is running locally. Join the thousands of families across the country who have benefited from the support and tips it provides for young families.

Research shows that the key ingredients to ensuring babies and young children have a healthy start in life are:

- Parenting confidence
- Physical activity for little ones
- What children and families eat
- Family lifestyle habits
- Enjoying life as a family

The programme covers these 5 themes across 8 weeks and provides everything you need to help get your little one off to a great start.

Weekly sessions

Each week helps you provide a healthy, happy, supportive environment for the whole family.

Week 1 - Decide what changes you want to make and set your own goals

Week 2 - How to juggle life with young children so you all get what you need

Week 3 - How to respond to children's needs without giving in to all their demands

Week 4 - Positive mealtime tips for a happy family - reducing mealtime stress for everyone

Week 5 - Ideas for active play to help children learn, develop and stay happy

Week 6 - Food groups, food labels, portion sizes for under 5s, first foods, and snack swaps

Week 7 - Understanding and managing your child's behaviour for a happier home

Week 8 - Celebrate your success as a parent and plan the future for your family

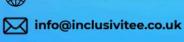

What is the Nurturing Programme?

Children are rewarding, stimulating and fun, but looking after them can be stressful and challenging.

The Nurturing Programme helps deal with those challenges so that you can have a calmer, happier life.

A tried and tested programme, it helps us think about what we do, why we do it and how it makes us feel

The Building Blocks of the Nurturing Programme





what does it cover?

Over the 10-week Programme, you will look at lots of different topics, including:

Understanding why children behave as they do

Recognising the feelings behind behaviour (ours and theirs)

Exploring different approaches to discipline

Finding ways to develop co-operation and self-discipline in children

Learning the importance of looking after ourselves

Practical information

Partners are welcome and it's also fine to come on your own or with a relative or friend

There are ten 2-hour sessions with a tea and coffee break

8-10 parents are invited and there are two Family Links trained group leaders

Some groups provide a creche; check with group leaders beforehand

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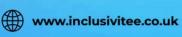

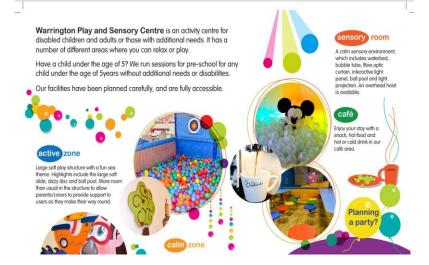

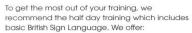

Children and Young People

We offer a wide range of support services and activities for D/deaf children and young people aimed at reducing isolation, growing confidence and enabling greater independence:

- Youth Clubs
- Peer Support and Role Models
- Social Groups
- Work Experience
- Youth Residentials
- Children's Play Activities

Family Support

Our family support services have been developed in response to the needs identified by families living with deafness or hearing loss. Our experienced staff team offer support to families from the point of diagnosis and at any stage throughout their journey, offering a range of services:

- Advice and Information
- Family Sign Sessions
- One to Ones
- Happy Hands (Family Support Group)
- Social Groups
- Drop Ins
- Peer Support

Specialist support includes supporting parents/carers with Education, Health and Care Plans (EHCP), benefit claim forms and attending statutory meetings such as Child Protection Conferences. We also support parents/carers seeking an appropriate education setting to ensure that the needs of the child or young person are met.

Training and Learning

We offer non accredited and accredited training through our affiliation with the awarding body Signature. Our training and learning includes:

- Introduction to BSL
- Signing Sessions
- British Sign Language Level 1 & 2

Eligibility

The family, children and young people services we provide are open to anyone living in the Merseyside Region who is living with deafness or hearing loss. Alongside funding from BBC Children in Need, a new initiative (I CAN), funded by Lottery Community Fund, has enabled us to expand our work into other parts of the region.

All the services are free to the individual (with some exceptions of training and learning sessions).



How to get involved in the project

What are Direct Payments?

A Direct Payment is money from your local authority allowing you to buy the care your child needs instead of having services organised by them.

You have the right to choose direct payments rather than getting support organised by your local authority. If you are already getting help from the local authority, you can ask for direct payments instead.

If you do not currently get help, you will first need to ask social services to assess your child's care needs. You can only get direct payments if you have been assessed by social services as needing care and support services.

Who can receive Direct Payments?

- Those with Parental Responsibility for a disabled child under 16.
- A person with Parental Responsibility can receive direct payments for a disabled child or young person if they have been assessed by the Local Authority as eligible for a service.
- If a disabled child or young person is not receiving the appropriate services from the Local Authority or their needs have changed, a reassessment should be requested.
- Disabled young people aged 16 or 17.

Where a child or young person has an Education, Health & Social Care Plan, direct payments can be made to:

- A person who is a parent of the child;
- The young person if they are over 16; or A nominee who has been nominated in writing, by the
- child's parent or young person, to receive the direct payments on their behalf.



How the Deafness Resource Centre can support you.

There are many organisations providing care services including the Deafness Resource Centre who are approved to provide care, support, and activities for D/deaf children and young people.

You can use Direct Payments to buy services from an organisation or service provider that offers care, such as a private agency, a voluntary organisation such as the Deafness Resource Centre or a nursery. Alternatively, you can employ someone yourself (known as a Personal Assistant – PA).

- Develop life skills such as cookery, independent travel, shopping, budgeting.
- Exploring and developing hobbies, interests and trying new experiences.
- Encourage positive friendships and role models.
- Increase confidence and motivation.
- Visit places of interest and days out.

If you are already receiving a Personal Budget or Direct Payments and would like to nominate the Deafness Resource Centre as your preferred supplier then you are more than welcome to arrange a meeting here, or at a place of your choosing, to discuss things further.
