

cats we do not know and the local police. This year NSPCC will be delivering workshops to the children to share their expertise on keeping us all safe.


Black History Month October 2019



Anti-Bullying Week 11th November 2019

Every year we take part in anti-bullying week in our school. We follow advice and guidance from the Anti-Bullying alliance and work on the chosen focus for the year. We share our learning and work with our parents and community during the Friday assembly. This year the Alliance has announced the theme of Anti-Bullying Week 2019 as 'Change Starts With Us', underlining how everyday acts like listening to young people, having a conversation, thinking about the impact of our words or stopping before hitting 'like' on a hurtful social media post, can help to reduce bullying.



Christmas Celebrations (beginning) 10th December 2019

We always look forward to our Christmas celebrations at Our Lady's and we make this time as special as we can for the children. Our Christmas nativity this year will be led by our Infants. We are sure you will all enjoy singing along to the songs at home in preparation for our annual nativity production. 
Halton Arts Primary Network (HPAN) February 2020

This year we will be participating once again in the annual HPAN performing arts and art exhibition. The dance and drama group will be performing at the Brindley Theatre, whilst the whole school will contribute to the school art exhibition, that will be displayed in the Runcorn Shopping City.



World Book Day 5th March 2020

This annual event always engages both children, and staff's imaginations. We all relish the opportunity to dress up as favourite book characters, and taking part in a wonderful variety of activities, that often include art, music, PE and outdoor learning. Literature is truly brought alive. In the past we have focused on themes – such as 'Fairy Tales', authors, such as Colin McNaughton, or books – such as 'Where the Wild Things Are'.



This coming year, we will be focusing on Non-Fiction books. Each class will choose from our excellent supply of top quality, award winning books – such as The Big Book of Bugs by Yumal Zommer, amongst others, to explore how creative and inspiring information books can be.

The children will be provided with a book token voucher which can be redeemed at all major book - sellers, or at our annual book fayre, which follows World Book Day. Our fantastic parents always give superb support to this event, allowing us to buy even more exciting books for our children.



French Day 20th March 2020



French day will be another day of fun and enjoyable activities based around different aspects of French culture, language and traditions. The children will have the opportunity to sample a typical French breakfast, play the traditional game of 'boules', undertake art work in the style of

French artists and to further extend their understanding and appreciation of the French language through interactive games and activities.

Keeping me Healthy Week 30th March 2020

During this themed week we are supported in school by Halton Healthy Schools team who deliver Fit4Life and Healthitude sessions to our children in Key Stage 2. In year 1 we also put on a musical called Sugar – the musical to spread the important message about the amount of sugar we have in our diet. Children enjoy learning about the benefits of eating a balanced diet and exercising regularly.





Themed Days/Weeks Summer Term



Keep Me Happy Week 5th May 2020

This week gives all our children the chance to reflect on ways that enable them to feel happy and to give their best. We share many strategies to allow us to keep our mental health healthy, we use the 5 ways to wellbeing to learn about what we can do to nurture our own mental health, as well as taking part in exercise, yoga, peer massage, mindfulness and other relaxation techniques.



World Environment Day 5th June 2020

To celebrate World Environment Day our Eco Guardians will lead a whole school assembly. They will talk about the World Environment Day focus for 2020 and will launch a whole school competition to promote awareness of how to be more environmentally friendly.



Sports Day 18th June 2020

Weather permitting, we will hold our annual sports day on the school field. Reception class, Year 1 and Year 2 children will participate in a range of fun activities throughout the morning and Years 3,4,5 and 6 will complete their session in the afternoon. 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Fund Raising and Awareness Raising Days

Macmillan Coffee Morning 27th September 2019

Each year the school supports this charity and children are asked to bring cakes into school on the morning of 27th September. You are also invited to attend our Coffee morning 9.00am until 11.10am, where you will be able to spend time with your children in the school hall, whilst also raising money for this worthwhile cause.





Harvest Festival 18th October 2019

Pupil Voice

School Council (Mrs McGuffie)

Our School Council is comprised of pupils from every class from Year 1 to Year 6. These children are voted in by their peers and as such will represent them in making decisions regarding our school and take an active role in fundraising.



Eco- Guardians (Miss Corkill)

Our Eco- Guardian Group has pupils from every class from Year 1 to Year 6. As a group we meet up half termly and discuss ways that we can make our School more environmentally friendly. We also lead assemblies on days such as; 'World Environment Day' and visit local recycling centres to develop our knowledge on recycling.



Reading Buddies (Mrs Hignett)

The Reading Buddy scheme has been running now for the last two years, and has certainly ignited a love of reading amongst our children. On Tuesdays and Thursdays Reading Buddies from two of our four houses take turns to bring a selection of books out onto the playgrounds, (or into classrooms if it's raining), and share books for pleasure with each other.

The Buddies have special bags, and they choose which books to take out – helped by the Y6 Librarians. The younger children look forward to sharing books and stories with older siblings, and the older children enjoy helping their fellow pupils learn to read. It is wonderful to see our children of differing ages coming together over a good story. This is peer support, run by the children for the children.

Librarians (Mrs Hignett)

Each year, a group of 6 Librarians from Year 6, volunteer to support the work of the school library.

The library is open for KS2 children every Friday at 12:30 pm, alternating between Y3/4 and Y5/6, where the children can borrow a book for 2 weeks. The Librarians, help the children to choose books, read them stories and record which books have been borrowed, and by whom.

Although KS1 children visit the library with their class teachers on a weekly basis, the Librarians enjoy inviting the younger children in to the library to have a story read to them on specific lunchtimes.

The librarians also enjoy running competitions throughout the year, organise themed displays, recommending books, completing reviews, and helping to promote and support the annual Book Fair.

They're wonderful advocates of our 'Reading for Pleasure' status, and helped us to achieve the Quality Reading Mark accreditation.

E Safety Group (Mr Easby)

The E-safety Group is set to give parents, children and governors a role in constructing and updating our e-safety policy and practises. Our E-Safety governor, Ms Houghton, meets with Mr Easby, the Digital Leaders and parents, once a year to develop and update our practice to ensure we meet the changing needs of our parents and pupils.

Digital Leaders (Mr Easby)

The Digital Leaders are Year 6's group of computer experts. They know the ins and outs of our systems and how to fix problems, they know and are trained in e-safety matters and work with Mr Easby to update and improve our hardware. With these expertise, they are the go-to group for any computer problems or E-Safety issues, for both the pupils and the staff!

Cyber Buddies (Mr Easby)

As the Digital Leaders can't be in every class all the time, we have Cyber Buddies chosen by each class to be the Digital Leader's deputies. The Cyber Buddies are the first port of call for any and all e-safety problems and they know exactly what to do and who to report it to.

Junior Safety Officers (Miss Quirk)

In Year 6, we have four Junior Safety Officers. At different times of the year they run competitions for the children to enter. The competitions are based on various themes e.g. 'How to cross the road safely'. It is the Junior Safety Officers responsibility to choose the winners and present them with their prizes during school assemblies.

House Teams

Your child will be a member of one of our four school houses: Knock, Lourdes, Walsingham and Fatima.

All four houses are named after one of Our Lady's shrines.

Our Lady of Knock

Our Lady of Knock is a Catholic shrine in the village of Knock in County Mayo in the Republic of Ireland. An apparition of our Lady appeared to a number of villagers on 21st August 1879. The feast day for Our Lady of Knock is on 21st August.



Our Lady of Lourdes

Our Lady of Lourdes is a Catholic shrine in the French town of Lourdes. It is where our Lady appeared to a young girl called Bernadette on a number of occasions during 1858. Many pilgrims who visit Lourdes are drawn by their faith in the miraculous cures attributed to the waters of the shrine. The feast day for Our Lady of Lourdes is on 11th February.

Our Lady of Walsingham

Our Lady of Walsingham is associated with the Marian apparitions to an English noblewoman, in 1061 in the village of Walsingham in Norfolk, England. The feast day for Our Lady of Walsingham is on 24th September





Our Lady of Fatima

Our Lady of Fatima is in Portugal where Mary appeared to three shepherds in 1817. The feast day of Our Lady of Fatima is 13th May.

Curriculum Enrichment

Modern Foreign Language

The learning of a foreign language provides a valuable educational, social and cultural experience for the pupils. The children will develop communication and Literacy skills that lay foundation for their future language learning. Children from Year 3 to Year 6 receive weekly French lessons; the lessons promote French in a fun and enjoyable way. Across the academic year, all year groups will also have the opportunity to attend an after school French club.



Theatre Productions



To enrich our curriculum at Our Lady's our children have the opportunity to visit a local theatre. The whole school visits the Brindley theatre to watch the annual pantomime, whilst the dance and drama club perform on the stage, as part of the Halton Primary Arts Network (HPAN) Performing Arts Production.

We have also had visiting theatre groups to help bring our curriculum to life. For example, Year 1 'Sugar the Musical', West End Theatres - 'Bringing Books Alive' dance workshops and The Snap Trap- to raise the awareness of staying safe on line.

Theatre productions really help our children to appreciate the arts and value dance, drama and music.

Music

For this academic year, Accent Music Services will be delivering Ukele lessons to Year 3, 4 and 5. In previous years the children have had the opportunity to be taught the violin, trumpet, trombone and African drumming. Each year they have participated in a concert, celebrating their new found musical skills to their parents and family.



Sports Events

In the summer term each Key Stage holds their sports day. Family members are more than welcome to come along to support and cheer the children on.

The children have opportunities to take part in inter-school tournaments throughout the year. We have a busy calendar for KS1 and KS2 and this allows children to compete across Widnes, Cheshire and Liverpool, in a variety of different sports and enables them to apply skills that they have learnt through curriculum P.E. and after school activities.

P.E

At Our Lady's we endeavour to make P.E. lessons as enjoyable as possible for all through a well-planned and challenging curriculum where children become confident with their abilities, increase their knowledge of health and related fitness and help them to find ways to continue to be physically active outside of school.

As a school, we work closely with Halton School games, Beth Tweddle gymnastics, Widnes Rugby Union and Widnes Vikings.

We have recently attained the Gold Games award!

Swimming

Year 6 will go swimming every Tuesday for the whole of the Autumn Term.

Year 5 will then participate in their swimming lessons on a Tuesday for the rest of the academic year. (Spring and Summer term).

Swimming lessons take place at Kingsway Leisure Centre.

After School Activities

At Our Lady's we pride ourselves on providing opportunities to all children regardless of their gender, educational and physical needs to have access to a wide and varied range of after school activities. All staff give up their time voluntarily and are committed to enriching the children's school life.
