## Proposed spend of Pupil Premium - 2017/18

The Pupil Premium provides funding for pupils:

- who have been in receipt of free school meals (FSM) at any point in the past 6 years (£1320 per child)
- who have been continuously looked after for the past six months (£1900 per child)
- for children whose parents are currently serving in the armed forces (£300 per child)

Schools are held accountable for the spending of these monies, performance tables will capture the achievement of disadvantaged students covered by the Pupil Premium.

Our Lady of Perpetual Succour Catholic Primary School is committed to providing effective resources and ensuring support is in place for our disadvantaged students to improve their academic outcomes.

This document details the proposed spend of the Pupil Premium 2017/18.

#### STATISTICS 2017-18

- In school we have 51 pupils who are entitled to benefit from the additional funding.
- Each entitled pupil received £1320 per annum.

In 2017-18 the school received £67,320 additional funds. This figure is subject to change once final figures are released. A proportion of the Pupil Premium is committed to maintaining the provision for disadvantaged students that is currently in place.

# There are three key objectives:

- 1. Attainment in Literacy and Numeracy: to improve the outcomes for PP pupils in Literacy and Numeracy.
- 2. To improve the level of disadvantaged pupils achieving greater depth in reading, writing and maths.
- 3. To improve curriculum engagement and academic achievement for PP pupils.
