#### **Learning Means the World Curriculum**

#### **Reception**

Reception class have enjoyed the topic 'Let's Play' this half term and have become immersed in the storybook The Naughty Bus. Reception class have been learning about where the London Naughty Bus comes from using Google maps to find London, as well as researching famous London landmarks including the London Eye, Tower Bridge, Big Ben, and Buckingham Palace. We also looked at how toys are made and found out how a teddy bear is made. In our writing, Reception class have been doing some descriptive writing, describing the Naughty Bus, and designing and describing a new Space Ranger toy. Reception class have also been using their imagination and creativity to design and make their own Naughty Bus using different materials whilst having lots of fun making them too. We are really looking forward to ending our topic with a Teddy Bear's Picnic with our favourite teddy or toy.









#### <u>YEAR 1</u>

Year 1 have been learning about our local community. They have enjoyed going for a walk in our local area looking at the different road signs, street names and people that live in our area. We have been looking at things from a birds eye view and have been using Google maps and Google Earth to identify human and physical features from which they have really enjoyed.

Year 1 have also enjoyed learning about Plants. They have been busy looking at the different plants we have at our school and writing descriptions about them. They have also been learning about the different parts of flowers and trees and how the different parts function and what they do.

# <u>YEAR 2</u>

Year 2 have really enjoyed their 'Land Ahoy!' topic this half term. We looked at maps and atlases and then created our own treasure maps. We had lots of fun reading each other's maps and following instructions using directional language such as; north, south, east and west to find the treasure.

In music we enjoyed listening to the song Shiver my Timber! We also used percussion instruments to help us perform the song and remember the lyrics. Throughout the topic we have also been learning about Madagascar. We researched Madagascar and created our own fact files about it. We had lots of fun researching all the animals in Madagascar.











## YEAR 3

#### Athens V Sparta

Year 3 have enjoyed our topic 'Athens V Sparta: Ancient Greece' this half term and we learned all about Ancient Greece. We have studied the beautiful landscape of Greece, its islands and miles of beautiful coastline, as well as the history and traditions of this ancient land. We made traditional Greek urns, and looked at the climate and the food that is grown there. We learned that Ancient Greece was a very powerful empire between 2000 BC and 146 BC and was responsible for introducing democracy, as well as many new ideas for government, science, philosophy and art.

The alphabet, Olympic Games, the marathon and the theatre are all Ancient Greek inventions, and the Greeks were responsible for lots of building and construction styles that exist today.







We also compared two cities that existed in ancient times (Athens and Sparta) and looked at their similarities and differences, observing what it would be like to grow up there.

We have also studied lots of Greek myths and legends and learned all about the Greek Gods and Goddesses who lived on Mount Olympus and how the Greeks made sense of the world, animals and how people came to be through the telling of these stories.

#### <u>YEAR 4</u>

During this half-term, Year 4 have been working extremely hard learning all about 'Law and Order'. We have looked at the concept of justice and citizenship, focusing on the importance of leadership and understanding what makes a good leader, why we need leaders and what different leadership roles exist. We have been learning about the importance of rules and how to recognise issues of justice, rights, and responsibilities. During our lessons, we always aim to work co-operatively with one another, developing awareness of the impact of our decisions on others. We clearly expressed this during our PE/Dance lessons when we played fun, fast paced games that required group co-operation. This led to working closely with partners, guiding and controlling their movements as we developed and performed a co-operative duet demonstrating moves, ensuring they were performed fluidly and simultaneously.







#### <u>YEAR 5</u>

This half term we have started our new Dimensions topic on 'Invaders and Settlers', which focuses closely on the ancient Romans. On Friday 18<sup>th</sup> March we visited Chester Grosvenor Museum to find out why the Romans settled in Chester.

Our trip began with us meeting a Roman gladiator in full authentic armour. His name was Claudius Crasius (which means ugly in Latin!) We then had to put on our own armour – called lorica segmentata, and carry a shield (scutum), before pledging allegiance to the Roman Empire. We were then ordered to march to the amphitheatre, where we had lots of fun learning battle formations, to beat the Celts (teachers!)



On the way back to the museum, Ethan kept us all in line by leading the chant: 'Sin, sin, sin, dex, sin', which means 'Left, left, left, right, left.'



After a well - earned lunch in the King's Arms Kitchen, we were treated to a fascinating workshop led by a very knowledgeable historian called Jenny. The time went by far too quickly, and we all agreed it was a fantastic day out and a great way to learn about the Romans in Britain.



Some of your pupils' work has been selected for publication!

This week we have just discovered that some poems we entered into the 'Young Writer's' competition are going to be published! Out of 10,000 entries all of ours have been selected for publication. The anthology will be out in June, and our school will receive a free copy, which will be on display in the library. We break up for Easter very happy bunnies – it's official – Year 5 are about to become published authors!

<u>YEAR 6</u>

Year 6 Learning Means the World Topic this half term has been Wars of the World. The topic asks us to consider current wars and the reasons why wars begin. Year 6 were sensible and mature while we discussed the current war in Ukraine, and they produced wonderful poetry about the plight of refugees. They also produced beautiful artwork depicting their designs of a modern-day equivalent of the poppy – something to symbolise this war and the hopes that the world has for people of the Ukraine.

This year during Autism Awareness Week every class has taken part in activities and looked at some of the wonderful resources from The National Autistic Society.

We all learnt so much, and the children were truly enthralled listening to such a wonderful, heartfelt presentation.

#### Polite reminder - Snack/Dinner Account

As previously mentioned, there has been an addition to the SchoolComms this year and that is a reminder is automatically generated if your account goes into debit.

For the snack account, it will automatically send you a reminder to top up when it goes below £5.00 if it goes over £5.00 you will have to supply a snack for your child as they will not receive snack until it's topped up.

For the dinner account, it will automatically send you a reminder to top up when it goes below £12.50. Again, you will have to supply a packed lunch until your dinner account has been topped up.
