RECEPTION

This term Reception have been very busy. We have been reading the story 'The Naughty Bus' and the children have loved learning about double decker buses and doing some role play in the 'bus station' cabin.

We have been doing lots of work on double numbers, pairs, number bonds to 10 and 'more than' and 'fewer than'.

Reception have loved learning about different types of vehicles and what they do and the sounds they make. They have made brilliant vehicles with recyclable materials and have thought about different adventures they would go on and what vehicles they would need to get there.

We have been working on ball skills in PE focusing on control, catching and throwing. The children have been fantastic at this. They have also been doing their forest school sessions. We have made bug hotels, done mud painting, cloud gazing and made portraits using leaves, sticks and stones.

We have some new visitors in our class. The children will be observing caterpillars over the next few weeks and will be looking at the different stages of them turning into butterflies.

Our garden has got some new flowers in it which were planted by the children who would make brilliant gardeners!

We celebrated the King's Coronation and had a visit from Rock Kids and had our very own rock concert which we loved!

Reception had their class assembly, on 'May the month of Mary' and they were absolutely fantastic. We are so proud of you Reception, keep up the good work!























Year 1 have been learning all about 'The Arctic' this half term and finding out what animals live in the Arctic as well as the learning about the different climates around the world. Children loved being weather reporters and talking about the weather in the UK, the Amazon Rainforest and the Arctic and were able to recognise hot and cold areas of the world. We have enjoyed reading our key text 'Winter Sleep' and learnt lots about hibernation and which animals hibernate and why they hibernate in the winter. Year 1 have been writing about the hibernation of a dormouse, comparing the secret glade in the season of Summer and Winter, as well as creating their own version of the story 'Winter Sleep'.

Year 1 have really enjoyed their Music (Charanga) lessons, having fun with improvising, and learning about pulse, rhythm and pitch. Children were fantastic singing and performing the song 'Getting dressed' and are becoming more confident improvising and composing a song using musical instruments.

In Come and See Year 1 have been learning about 'Holidays and Holydays'. Year 1 were fantastic creating their own dance showing the sequence of the events of Pentecost Day. They also created different movements using streamers and enjoyed performing their own dance to the class in small groups.

Well done for all your excellent work this half term Year 1.















Year 1 particularly enjoyed the 'Rock Kidz' on tour and learnt a song called 'Nobody Like Me' reminding them they are unique and special.

During this half term, Year 2 have been working hard in all aspects of the curriculum. We have had a huge focus on handwriting in class and the children have produced some beautiful work because of this. One of our favourite sessions this term has been Forest Schools – the children love it. We have explored the woods, searched for mini beast, built our own Bug Hotels, and made some clay faces on the trees. Exploring outside if something we all enjoy. We have also been lucky enough to have Widnes Vikings in to develop our rugby skills. We have been focusing on our speeds, strength, agility, and ball skills. In Geography, we have been learning all about Llandudno and everything it has to offer – from its wonderful beaches to the amazing Great Orme.











The Stone Age

Year 3 have enjoyed our topic this half term, learning about how early man lived and survived thousands of years ago. In history, we have studied the Stone Age through to the Iron Age and learned about 'Lindow Man' - the well-preserved body of an Iron-Age man discovered in Lindow Moss peat bog in Cheshire in 1983, as well as the famous Boudica, a Celtic queen who led a revolt against Roman rule in Ancient Britain in A.D. 60 or 61.

We also learned about how people lived and worked in this period and studied a 3D model of one of the most famous Stone Age farm dwellings to exist – 'Skara Brae' on the Scottish Isle of Orkney.

We read the book 'Pebble in my Pocket', which was the inspiration for some fantastic comic strips written by the class and also read the story 'Stone Age Boy' which helped us to imagine and write about what life was like in this period. In science, we studied rocks and soil, and learned about the different types of rocks and how they are formed. We also learned about the role that volcanoes and glaciers played in the creation of our planet as well as where most volcanoes are found on Earth.

We created some beautiful artwork based on a local rock sculpture called 'Moongate' as well as enjoying lots of celebrations for the Coronation and Eurovision. In PE, we have enjoyed learning how to play rounders and practice our tennis skills. And last but not least, the visit from 'Rock Kidz on Tour' was truly unforgettable and we had so much fun dressed up in true rock star style!









Year 4 have had so much fun this half-term! We loved our school visit from Rock Kidz where we had the opportunity to sing and dance like rock stars. We've been getting fit in P.E. during our fitness lessons, timing our sprinting and devising a mini circuit with exercises we've learnt about. Our History topic has been about the 'Saxon King'. We have thoroughly enjoyed exploring and learning about the inspirational story of Harold Godwinson, the final Anglo-Saxon King of England. A lesson we particularly enjoyed was when we were put into groups and had to research the different candidates' claim to the throne after Edward the Confessor died. Each group put together a speech where we aimed to convince the Witan Council to choose their claimant. We had so much fun planning and delivering these speeches and deciding who would be the next King of England.













This half term we have emerged ourselves in the culture and beliefs of Ancient Egypt. We have looked at where Egypt is in the world, and the importance of the river Nile to its economy, now and in the past. We have looked at maps of where the important places and antiquities are located, creating maps using 4 figure grid references both in our books and on the playground.





Our writing has also been inspired by the Ancient Egyptians. We read Ma'at's Feather by Juliet Desailly, and then imagined how exciting it must have been for Howard Carter to finally discover the tomb of Tutankhamun after years of searching:





We had fun making our own little mummies and placed them in their sarcophagi. We also really enjoyed researching Ancient Egyptian beliefs and customs. They would place all the deceased pharaoh's vital organs into little jars, called canopic jars, to preserve them for the 'after-life'. The lids of the jars represented some of their gods, such as the jackal-headed Anubis. We designed our canopic jars, based on the original ones, and then made them from clay in DT:







In PE we have thoroughly enjoyed improving our rugby skills with Widnes Vikings:



All our class performed incredibly well, and completed the exams by showing excellent resilience and composure - even if they were very hard this year! Mr Easby and Mrs Heston could not be prouder of the hard work, commitment, and maturity the children showed in the face of pressure. A huge well done to them all! To celebrate we had our traditional sweet hunt in the woods. It is also important to remember that while SATs measure the children's progress in Maths and English, they do not measure the amazing progress they have made as individuals over the year. The children have developed in confidence and maturity, resilience and determination, not to mention how well they have improved in the many other subjects not assessed by SATs. Now we can take that maturity and confidence in the remaining time at Our Ladys, and we look forward to our residential visit to Plas Menai after half term.
