The Birth of CAFOD

In 1960, the Catholic Women's League and Union of Catholic Mothers, encouraged by what they had seen Catholic women's organizations in Austria doing the previous year, held a Family Fast Day and encouraged people to give what they would have spent on food to a collection to help with a project in Dominica. It was a great success.

Arising out of this, the Bishops of England and Wales in 1962, registered a new Catholic overseas aid project to be called, CAFOD, which would be our part of the international federation of Catholic aid organizations, most of which are called Caritas followed by the name of the country. England and Wales, Scotland and Ireland are unusual in having our own special names, CAFOD, SCIAF and TROCAIRE. But all part of Caritas Internationalis, with presence worldwide.

Over the years, CAFOD has developed a great experience in working in countries where there has been some sort of disaster and will sometimes be asked by Caritas to take the Catholic lead in a particular situation. It is a member of the British Disasters Emergency Committee and of the British Overseas Aid Group. The present Director of CAFOD, Christine Allen, who, as a young graduate, was the Secretary of our diocesan Justice and Peace Commission. She attended Sacred Heart High School in Crosby.

CAFOD grew out of two Family Fast days a year and they are still a key source of funding for its work and link our families closely to that work. Our schools are all great supporters and learn so much about the world and it's needs, through their connection with CAFOD with serious focus on the environment these days. It is the poor who suffer most from the environmental degradation.

CAFOD worked with St Oscar Romero in El Salvador and he is their patron saint.

We are studying the criteria for grants with the local authority, so that the overall cost is kept to a minimum. We are in touch with the Historic Churches Commission and other relevant bodies to ensure that we are not contravening the integral fabric of this sacred space, and we always take professional advice whenever something is restored or moved as we wish to make prudent decisions that honour this historic place of worship. Much work is happening behind the scenes as we try to safeguard St Bede's for future generations.

In the weeks and months ahead, we will all need to be ready to adapt and change; we will have to endure inconveniences and things will not be as they were before. I suggest that we all try to keep focused on the bigger picture and when we see things changing, let us be the voice of positivity and hope and never the voice of complaint that undermines the good that is happening in our midst.
