Science and Faith

During this last week I have been working away in my job as a university lecturer, scientist and deacon. For the first part of the week, I was away in Leeds, presenting research on the diaconate at a conference. This spoke about data from a national questionnaire survey of deacons and how this may impact their future ministry. The second part of the week I was on residential fieldwork in Snowdonia, North Wales, teaching postgraduates how to collect data on upland vegetation and to work out how to analyse it to help conserve nature.

These work things were about collecting 'evidence' / 'data' and then to use it to 'prove' things scientifically. Nothing wrong with that at all in a general sense, but it's well worth thinking whether such approaches give us a full answer to all things. Personally, I doubt it.

Catholics believe that our belief in the existence of God gives a more comprehensive and coherent explanation of many aspects of the world than scientific evidence alone does. But this doesn't mean that science and scientific evidence has no place in our faith. Science aids understandings of our faith.

As the great mathematician and physicist John von Neumann once put it, "many things are easier to explain if there is a God than if there isn't."

Mark has presented the case for a new heating system to the Pastoral Organisation Committee, and they will make a recommendation to the Archdiocesan Trustees when they meet in the new year. Whilst we await their decision the Buildings Committee have investigated different affordable options for heating the church in the winter months. We have ordered 6 heaters which will be delivered in the next couple of weeks.

We shall see if these are sufficient for our needs. We might need to huddle up and sit closer together at Mass so that we can heat a specific area rather than the whole area of church, as this seems to be unmanageable with the restraints of cost and safety. Thank you for your understanding.
