#### Reflection

On Monday (28th September) I will celebrate the anniversary of my ordination to the priesthood – 35 years! Under normal circumstances this would have been a perfect excuse for us all to gather after Mass for coffee and some posh biscuits. This year, however, I will celebrate the 9.15 am Mass in St Michael's on Monday, but any coffee and posh biscuits will have to be consumed alone!

Although by nature I like to have things organised, planned, and mapped out well in advance, I could never have planned my priesthood as it has turned out. For example, I never imagined that I would be involved in Youth Ministry as I was in the 1990's, nor that I would go on the Missions to Latin America, firstly for six years and subsequently for another seven years. I certainly never expected to be preparing to go back for a third time in January. I did not even plan, expect, or ever imagine that I would end up in Widnes and meet all of you!

One of the most difficult aspects of the last six months has been the inability and futility of being able to organise, plan, and map out our lives. So many of us have had holidays cancelled, family celebrations curtailed, surgery postponed, our social interactions banned, our normal lives have become a distant memory. Our instinct to plan for the future – whether that be for next week or next year – is frustrated because of the current Coronavirus situation. And this is very annoying and depressing. For example, I cannot even book a flight to Peru yet because the border is closed, and international flights are not allowed in. I am feeling impatient and unable to control my future because I do not know when things will change.

Maybe one way to reduce the current stress and frustration about planning for the future in these uncertain times is to focus on it less and focus more on the present, the now, today. Let us give thanks to God for the blessings of today; for the kind words received; for family, for friends, for loved ones; and even for a decent cup of coffee and some posh biscuits.

#### **PARISH NOVENA 2020**

This year's Parish Novena to Our Lady will be celebrated at the 7.00pm Wednesday Mass in St Michael's church beginning on **October 7**<sup>th</sup> and ending nine weeks later, on **December 2**<sup>nd</sup>.

Each week we are invited to bring our Novena Petitions (please write them out at home before you come to Mass) and place them in the petitions box. The Mass will begin with the Novena prayers and intercessions, and during the *Salve Regina* (which will be sung by a soloist) the petitions box will be brought forward and placed on Our Lady's altar. The Opening Prayer of the Mass and the Readings will then follow, and the Mass will continue as normal.

We are also encouraged to pray the Rosary at home during these weeks of Novena for the intercession of Our Lady.

In light of the upsurge in Coronavirus figures, please can we remember Archbishop Malcolm's prayer for all people of the parish.

# **CHURCH IS OPEN FOR PUBLIC WORSHIP**

Please remember that Sunday obligation has not been restored. If you are able to, please consider attending a midweek Mass.

Please note that the churches will be open half an hour before Mass starts. This is to allow for controlled and staggered arrival times. Please consider this when making your plans and allow enough time.

#### PLEASE DO NOT PARK IN THE CHURCH CAR PARK

You **MUST** wear a face-covering as you enter church and throughout Mass.

- Please use the hand sanitisers provided as you enter and leave church.
- If you have a device or missal with text for Mass you may bring this with you.
- A steward will direct you to a seat.
- Holy Communion will be given out at the end of Mass.
  - A steward will invite each row forward in a pre-determined order.

#### Please wait to be invited before leaving your bench.

- o Take your face covering down when the person in front of you is receiving.
- Receive the host in your hand, step to the side, consume the host and then put your face covering back on.
- Make your way slowly and reverently out of church, using the one-way system.

We may have to stop offering public worship at very short notice following Archdiocesan and Government advice.
