HOW TO GO TO CONFESSION – A GUIDE.

Concern about the 'how' of confession can dissuade us. If this is you, then do not be afraid! I have put together this step-by-step guide to break down that barrier. Feel free to use it. It might help you, as we look forward to our Lenten reconciliation services.

PRAY and PREPARE. Ask God to enlighten you, as you read the Ten Commandments and/ or Beatitudes as a prompt. God is our priority, and we are to love Him above all. So firstly, ask yourself: Have I put anything or anyone ahead of God in my life? Then ask yourself: Have I put anything ahead of my brothers and sisters? Make sure to mention any mortal sins (see Catechism for more on this). If you've committed a particular sin more than once since your last confession, then try to remember how many times you've committed it. Try to recall when you last went to confession. Above all, just try your best and don't worry.

CONFESSION. Arrive in good time and take your seat. If there is a queue, use the time to pray. Once inside, begin with the Sign of the Cross, **"In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen."** The priest may make an opening remark. Then say, **"Bless me, Father, for I have sinned; it has been X days/ months/ years since my last confession."** You may also describe your state in life (I'm married, I'm single, I'm a priest, I'm a widow). After this, in your own words, make your confession of sins. You only need to mention the sins themselves. Don't explain yourself. Equally, don't mention other people's sins. Try to be to the point, as there will be other people awaiting their turn. At the end, you should say, **"and any sins I cannot recall"**. Again, just try your best and don't worry.

COUNSEL. The priest might give you some encouragement or advice. He will also give you your penance.

ACT OF CONTRITION. The priest will ask you to make an act of contrition. This should be printed in front of you. If not, the priest will help you.

ABSOLUTION. This is the central moment of confession. Bow your head, as you hear **'God, the Father of mercies...'** and make the sign of the cross, when you hear the Holy Trinity being mentioned.

PENANCE. Penance is a way of making it up to God. We do something positive to make up for the negative things we have done. Make sure to do your penance.

GRACE AND MERCY. Go in peace, knowing you have been forgiven and that God is imparting his grace to help you avoid sin in the future.
