The Sensory Hive are starting LEGO-Based therapy sessions at the centre from Thursday 20th April for children and young people from age 4+ and a basic level of verbal communication is required.

LEGO-based therapy is a fun and engaging intervention which aims to improve social communication skills. Groups are small (approximately 2-3) and facilitated by a qualified teacher, and a 6 week block is £60 (to bepaid in advance). Find out more and book your places <u>on their Facebook page</u>.
