The reasons are as follows:

- Too many children not wearing the correct school PE kit
- No clothes in school for children to wear or change into if they need it for any reason eg accidents or getting wet on the way to school
- Children need to be able to dress and undress themselves as this is a life skill and changing for PE gives them the opportunity to practise this skill twice a week to ensure that they can do this, within a set time, ready for high school.

Therefore, in **September PE kits are to come into school** in a bag labelled with your child's name and will stay in the cloakroom and be sent home each half term.

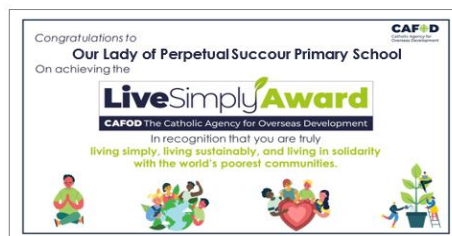
Live Simply Award

Booking School Snacks and Dinner



Please ensure that your child’s snack and dinner account is regularly monitored and maintained.

Key Things to Remember:

- **Meal & Snack Bookings:**
Please ensure that meals and snacks are booked in advance. You can book up to two weeks ahead, and all bookings must be completed by midnight the night before.
- **Account Credit:**
Make sure there is sufficient credit in your child’s account. If the account has insufficient funds, you will need to provide snacks or a packed lunch from home until the balance is topped up.
- **Absences:**
If your child is absent from school, it is your responsibility to cancel any pre-booked meals or snacks online. Failure to do so will result in charges still being applied.

Reception

This term in Reception has been full of wonder, discovery, and creativity. Our topic has been *Under the Sea*, and the children have been diving deep into learning about ocean life and exploring their imaginations in all areas of the curriculum.



We began the term by exploring a variety of fascinating sea creatures. The children loved learning facts about octopus, jellyfish, crabs, and many more marine animals. They enjoyed sharing what they'd learnt, asking curious questions, and taking part in art, role play, and topic-based activities that brought the underwater world to life.



Our phonics work has continued with great enthusiasm. The children have shown excellent focus and determination as they've practiced reading longer and more challenging words. It's been fantastic to see their reading confidence grow, and they are beginning to apply their phonics knowledge independently when reading and writing.



In Maths, we've been working with numbers up to 20. The children have been developing their skills in counting, number recognition, and problem solving. This term we introduced simple addition and subtraction, and the class have done a brilliant job using practical resources and pictures to help them solve problems and explain their thinking.

Reception



We've continued to use *Drawing Club* this term, linking our stories and writing to our *Under the Sea* theme. These sessions have sparked lots of creativity and imagination. The children have been inventing their own characters, creating exciting settings, and beginning to write simple sentences to describe their ideas.

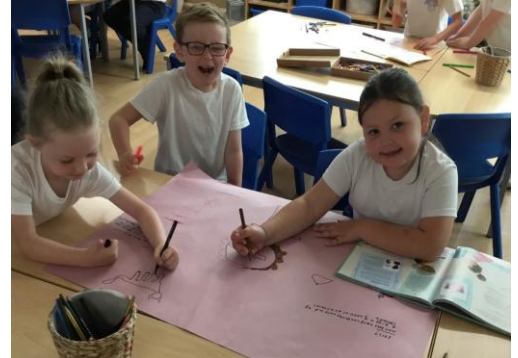
One of the highlights of our term was our school trip to the Liverpool Philharmonic. The children were captivated by the live orchestra performance of *We're Going on a Bear Hunt*. It was a magical experience that introduced them to live classical music in a fun and engaging way, and they loved joining in with the familiar story.

Year 1

During our last half term, Year 1 have enjoyed the topic 'Royal Patrons'. Children have researched and found out lots of key facts and information about Queen Elizabeth II to write a biography about her. We have also been using the computers to research and find out about Kings and Queens from the past and have been able to sequence the life of Queen Elizabeth II and Queen Victoria on a timeline.



Year 1 loved their lesson with Madame Buckley. They learnt about different French food and how to say different phrases in French.



Year 1

In science we planted a sunflower seed and enjoyed observing and talking about the changes over time, whilst also investigating which compost grows the tallest sunflower.



Year 1 have really enjoyed all of our practical maths lessons, learning about money, mass, volume and capacity.

The Children particularly enjoyed their D&T this half term and had fun designing and making, then eating a delicious fruit salad fit for a queen.



They also loved asking Mrs Naughton some of their own questions and learnt more about the parish family



You have all worked incredibly hard this year, well done Year 1! Keep up the fantastic work in Year 2.

Year 2

We have had a fantastic final half term in Year 2. We started the half term off with our school trip to Windmill Animal Farm. The children had a brilliant time from start to finish. We got to feed and hold lots of different animals and we also went on a ride around the farm. The ice cream was a delicious treat too!



In science we have been carrying out lots of investigations testing the properties of different materials.



We have been learning the time to 5-minute intervals in maths, the children are becoming a lot more confident with telling the time now!

Year 2



We have also had French Day and enjoyed learning all about the Tour De France.



We have been learning all about 'The Great Fire of London' in history. The children have found the topic very interesting, and we have completed lots of work about it. We have made timelines of the event, created newspaper reports about it and we also wrote diary entries too.

Well done on a brilliant final half term in Year 2, you have all shown you are ready for the juniors in September.

Year 3

We have had lots of lovely learning experiences this half term including our forest school activities which have been a real hit with the class. We have loved forest school and taken every opportunity to work and learn outside. We have perfected the art of making a shelter and made it very homely with log furniture, leaf carpets and sweeping brushes and formed our very own forest band singing all of our favourite songs and using lots of musical instruments.

Our book this term was the 'Shamen's Apprentice' linked to our Rainforest topic. We have learned so much about how we all have a part to play in protecting these irreplaceable natural resources to keep our planet healthy and ensure that the animals that live there do not lose their habitats or become endangered. We made some heartfelt posters about the importance of stopping deforestation and using sustainable palm oil products to protect the habitats of orang-utans, rhinos and tigers. There are so many things we can do such as buying and using sustainable products, recycling and reusing things and being mindful of the energy we use in our school and homes. We have also studied rainforest canopies and produced some lovely artwork based on our studies.

Our class trip to Norton Priory was just fantastic and we really wowed the guide with our expert knowledge about the Stone Age era at the workshop we attended. We also had great fun learning how to make fire, forage for food and spot animals in the wild.



French Day was also amazing and we got to taste some yummy French treats served to us by our wonderful year 6 pupils.



Year 3

And last but not least, the class were simply 'out of this world' singing and performing our Alien dance in the KS2 play- what a wonderful performance they gave and a fantastic way to end such a successful year.



Well done, thank you for all your hard work and have a wonderful summer Year 3!

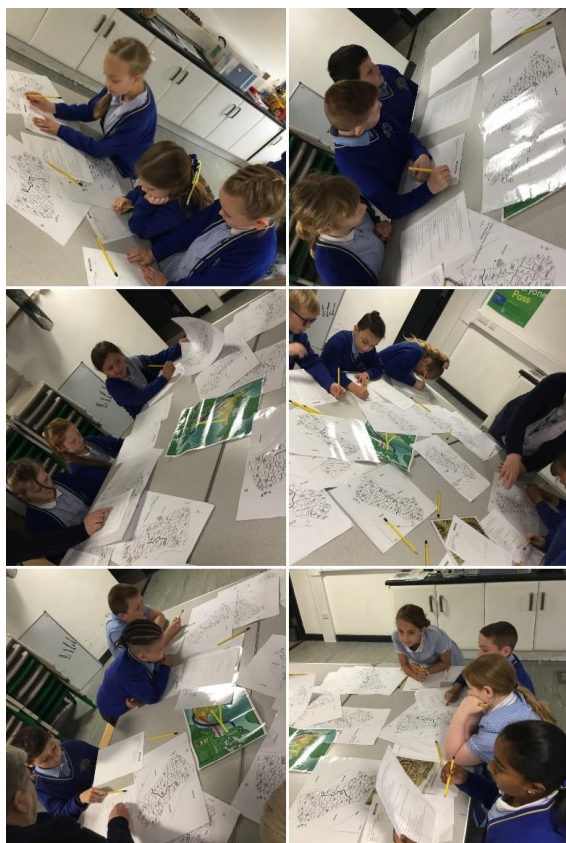
Year 4

During this half-term, Year 4 have been working exceptionally hard, learning all about Brazil and Scotland. We explored these continents finding some key facts about them and describing their physical features. Linking in with our science topic, we have been looking at animals and their habitats and the impact of climate change and deforestation. We produced a thought-provoking presentation using PowerPoint looking at the effect this has on these animals and where they live. In English, we loved reading our class book, 'The Miraculous Journey of Edward Tulane'. We produced some fantastic work especially our poem which focused on our feelings and senses and wrote some personal wishes just like a character did in the book.

We really enjoyed our class trip to Norton Priory. We learnt lots of things about the Anglo-Saxons, looking at many artifacts and participating in lots of activities. We particularly enjoyed dressing up as Anglo-Saxons and sitting around the campfire, making s'mores out in the woods.



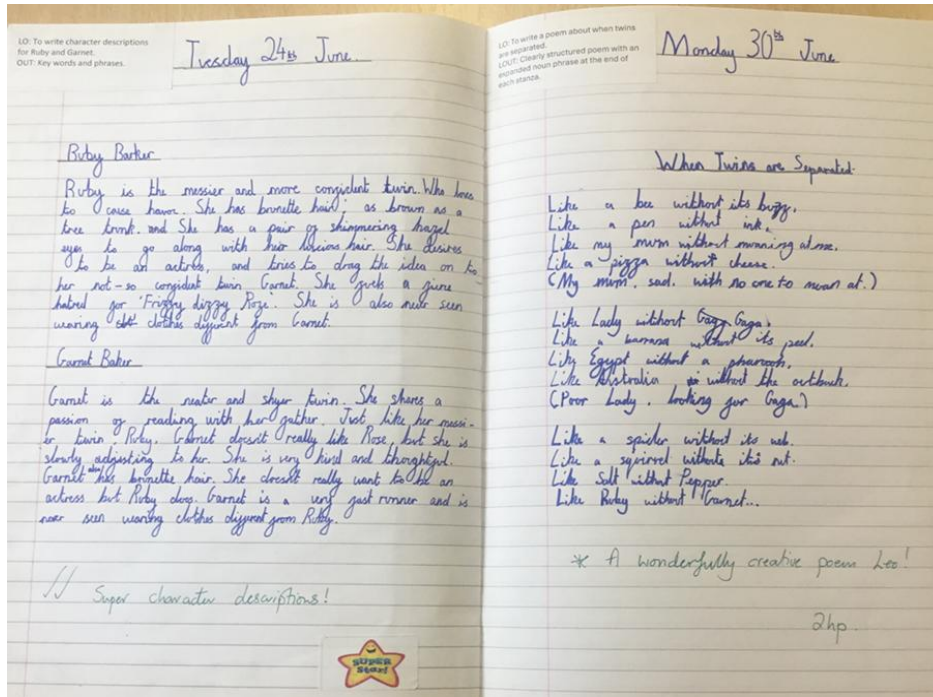
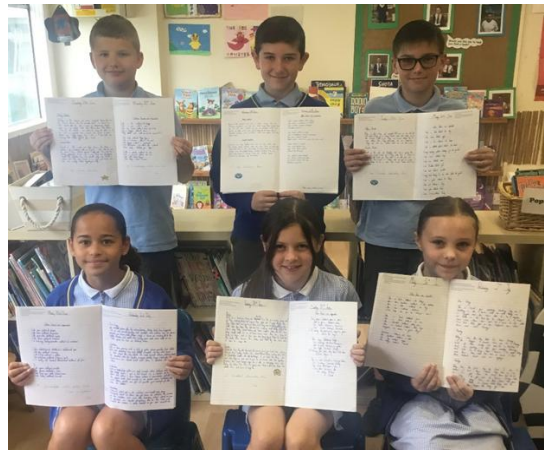

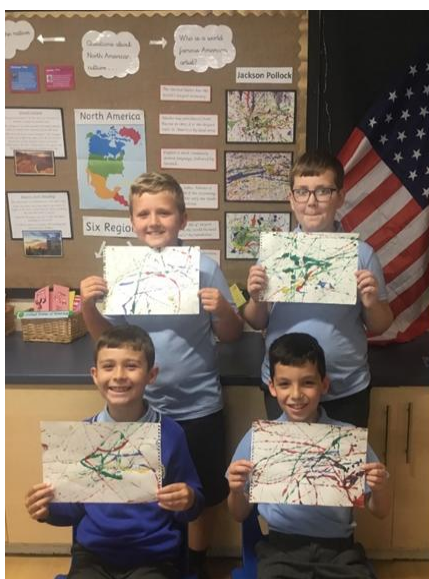

Year 5

We have been working extremely hard this term in preparation for our final year at Our Lady's. In English, our core text 'Double Act' has inspired lots of creative writing. We wrote character descriptions, diary entries from the perspective of one of the identical twins, and we also composed poetry, considering what life would feel like for Ruby and Garnet when they are eventually separated.



In our topic of North America, we studied the human and physical characteristics of this continent. The climate ranges from the Arctic tundra in the north, to the warm tropical regions of the south. As part of this work, we looked at the different tribes and culture of native America. This inspired us to design our own dream catchers, in contrast to the action paintings of Jackson Pollock.



Year 5

For our end of year day out we visited the International Eisteddfod in Llangollen. This is a music and arts festival featuring acts from all over the world. The day began with a visit to Thomas Telford's aqueduct at Pont which complemented our study of the canal system. We created artwork of the aqueduct and surrounding area in pencil and oil pastels. At the pavilion, we were treated to the beautiful sounds of a choir from Singapore, an energetic martial arts performance from India, singing and dancing performers from Zimbabwe, and an interactive story set to music by Sinfonia Cymru. Some of us got to try playing a harp!



Year 5

On the 30th June we took our pledge as 'Pilgrims of Hope' for the jubilee year. The day involved a collective worship at the start of the day then each class took a pilgrimage around the school grounds to the prayer garden. We created prayers as we thought about how we can be stewards of creation. Looking after each other and the environment are very high on our agenda. We are proud of our beautiful prayer garden and look forward to nurturing and caring for the plants and wildlife that God has provided for us. The day ended with 2 children from each class reading their prayers to the school in a final assembly, where we sang the jubilee hymn.



Finally, we had so much fun dancing as star ship troopers for our end of year summer show – Tobias could win competitions doing the 'Moon walk'!



Year 6

What a half term this has been for Year 6! We started off with our annual residential at Plas Menai. The children loved every second of it, and have made memories that will last a lifetime. They enjoyed the biking and climbing, tested themselves on the squirrel run and the low ropes and were thoroughly blown away by the speed of the J80 sailing ships. Year 6's behaviour, attitude and resilience were absolutely fantastic throughout the trip, and they should all be very proud of themselves; I know I am proud of them.



Once back from Plas Menai work began in earnest on our end of year play. I am always amazed just how talented Our Lady's children can be, from singing to dancing to being generally hilarious - the stage presence of some of our children is phenomenal. Once again the children showed how versatile they are with some fantastic performances both on and off the stage. As another school year draws to a close, we reflect on the successful year of a shared headship between Mrs McGuffie and Mrs Heston and the imminent retirement of our much-valued headteacher Mrs McGuffie after 26 years' service, 12 years as Headteacher at Our Lady of Perpetual Succour. We also look forward to the arrival of our new headteacher Miss Nutall who will be taking over in September.

It has been a very busy year, preparing for the successful visit of OFSTED in November and plenty of things to attend to such as the implementation of OPAL that many of you have had the chance to experience with your children. The OPAL play team (Mrs Heston, Miss Poulson, Mrs Riley and Miss Houghton – the play governor) have been instrumental in this with so much hard work and commitment needed.

The Catholic ethos continues to be paramount in our school through Faith in Action with the Live Simply award recently being granted to the school. This was achieved with hard work and commitment by all involved, demonstrating how we can all live sustainably.

Back to Mrs McGuffie. It would be remiss of us if we didn't mention some of Mrs McGuffie's achievements in her time at Our Lady's.
