Of course, it helps when parents and school work together to provide suitable role-models, demonstrating their respect for each other. Together, we can provide the education, the Catholic values and the ethos to support and help our children progress their education and grow into well-rounded, responsible and caring members of society. Thank you all for joining us in our vision – we make an excellent team!.

Our children are an inspiration ... their successes become our successes, their hopes and dreams become our hopes and dreams and we share in their joys and sorrows. The theme for the Year 6 leaving celebration in the summer was 'belief in oneself' and they sang this song.

hard work and commitment make a significant contribution towards the well-being and the education of our children.



Together, we can do anything!


