## Proposed spend of Pupil Premium - 2016/17

The Pupil Premium provides funding for pupils:

- who have been in receipt of free school meals (FSM) at any point in the past 6 years (£1320 per child)
- who have been continuously looked after for the past six months (£1900 per child)
- for children whose parents are currently serving in the armed forces (£300 per child)

Schools are held accountable for the spending of these monies, performance tables will capture the achievement of disadvantaged students covered by the Pupil Premium.

Our Lady of Perpetual Succour Catholic Primary School is committed to providing effective resources and ensuring support is in place for our disadvantaged students to improve their academic outcomes.

This document details the proposed spend of the Pupil Premium 2016/17.

## Projected Figures for April 2016- April 2017

- Total number of pupils on roll 207
- 41 pupils are eligible for PPG and will be entitled to £1320 per annum
- 2 pupils are eligible for PPG+ and they will be entitled to £1900 per annum The estimated Pupil Premium grant for the school is £57,920

In 2016-16 the school should receive £57,920 additional funds. This figure is subject to change once final figures are released. A proportion of the Pupil Premium is committed to maintaining the provision for disadvantaged students that is currently in place.

There are two key objectives:

- 1. Attainment in Literacy and Numeracy: to improve the outcomes for FSM pupils in Literacy and Numeracy.
- 2. Engagement: to improve curriculum engagement and academic achievement for FSM pupils.
