#### **RECEPTION**

Through these texts we learnt all about Africa and how it is different from the UK, different activities you can do at the beach, healthy eating, and facts about lighthouses. We wrote letters, postcards and fantastic sentences.

We've had a real focus on Phonics this term too and practiced lots of segmenting and blending, we have brilliant readers in Reception!

In Maths we have been focusing on numbers to 20. How to compose these numbers, subitising, comparing them with other numbers and adding and subtracting. We have used lots of manipulatives to help and focused on how to write number sentences correctly.

Sports day was so much fun. Reception showed such good sportsmanship and participated brilliantly. We have some super-fast runners!

We had our school trip to Imagine that! We did lots of role play in the imagination village, made slime, magnets, snow, and bath bombs, and most importantly had lots of fun!



























#### Yr 1

During our last half term Year 1 have enjoyed the topic 'Royal Patrons'. Children have researched and found out lots of key facts and information about Queen Elizabeth II to be able to write a biography about her. We have also been using the computers to research and find out about Kings and Queens from the past and looked at Queen Elizabeth II's family tree. Year 1 particularly enjoyed their D&T sessions this half term and had fun designing and making a delicious fruit salad fit for a Queen. In Science we had fun planting a sunflower seed and enjoyed observing and talking about the changes over time. Year 1 were fantastic during Sports Day and had so much fun participating in their races.

You have all worked incredibly hard this year, well done Year 1! Keep up the fantastic work in Year 2.



















# <u>Yr 2</u>

Year 2 have had another busy half term and worked very hard! In English and History, we have learnt about 'The Great Fire of London'. We have written some fantastic shape poems and wrote diary entries just like Samuel Pepys. In maths we have learnt all about time, volume and solving word problems using our four types of calculations. In Art we looked at the artwork of Andrew Goldsworthy and created our own clay sculptors using natural materials. We had great fun in PE learning Rugby skills with Widnes Vikings and had lots of fun on sports day. In our science work we found out about different animal habitats and investigated different waterproof materials.

We had a fantastic time at Delamere Forest creating animal habitats, a bug hunt and building shelters. In music we learnt how to play the glockenspiels and learnt lots of new songs. We have enjoyed using scratch to learn how to create a program using our own design.

Year 2 are ready now to move into the juniors for another exciting year ahead!



#### Yr 3

#### **Rainforests**

We have had lots of lovely learning experiences this half term including our forest school activities which have been a real hit with the class. Using our knowledge about Skara Brae (the Stone Age dwelling we studied last half term) Our class sourced natural materials and worked in teams to build a miniature version of the village. We have loved forest schools and taken every opportunity to work and learn outside. Our book this term was the 'Shamen's Apprentice' linked to our Rainforest topic and we have learned so much about how we all have a part to play in protecting these irreplaceable natural resources to keep our planet healthy and ensure that the animals that live there do not lose their habitats or become endangered. There are so many things we can do such as buying and using sustainable products, recycling and reusing things and being mindful of the energy we use in our school and homes. We have also learned about rainforest canopies and produced some lovely artwork based on our studies.

Our class trip to the Manchester Museum of Science and Industry was just fantastic and we really wowed the guide with our expert knowledge about forces and friction at the workshop we attended – he did say that he had never had such a knowledgeable class attend and know <u>all</u> the answers to his questions!

And, last but not least, the class were simply brilliant performing their song and dance at the KS2 play – what a wonderful performance they gave and a fantastic way to end such a successful year – well done Year 3!







#### <u>Yr 4</u>

During this half-term, Year 4 have been working exceptionally hard, learning all about the Arctic and Antarctica. We explored these continents finding some key facts about them and describing their physical features. Linking in with our science topic, we have been looking at animals and their habitats and the impact of climate change and deforestation. We produced a thought-provoking presentation using PowerPoint looking at the effect this has on these animals and where they live. In English, we loved reading our class book, 'The Miraculous Journey of Edward Tulane'. We produced some fantastic work especially our poem which focused on our feelings and senses and wrote some personal wishes just like a character did in the book.

We really enjoyed our class trip to the Science and Industry Museum. We learnt lots of new things about science and the history of Manchester industry.

Finally, what a fantastic performance we did in our end of year play! Year 4, you have been superheroes and super stars!!










## <u>Yr 5</u>

In computing we received expert tuition from Miss G, from Daresbury Laboratory, who introduced us to 'Crumble'. We managed to code a set of coloured lights to follow patterns and 'twinkle' them following different sequences. We learnt about 'nesting' which occurs when one programming construct is included within another. Miss G told us she'd never progressed as far with a KS2 class before – we were feeling very smart!





To complement our North American topic work, we studied the work of the artist Jackson Pollock, and created these masterpieces: Do you think they'll sell for 140 million US Dollars, like 'No. 5, 1948' by Pollock?!
