Psalm Response

'Send forth your Spirit, O Lord, and renew the face of the earth'.

How do we understand the Holy Spirit?

The Holy Spirit is a concept within the monotheistic faiths that trace their origins back to the biblical Abraham. In Judaism, the Holy Spirit is understood as the divine quality or force of God manifesting in the world, particularly in acts of prophecy, creation and guidance. In Islam the concept of the Holy Spirit exists as an agent of divine action or communication. In the Christian denominations that follow the teaching of the Nicene Creed, the concept is expanded in meaning to represent the third person of the Trinity, co-equal and co-eternal with God the Father and God the Son. We believe that the Holy Spirit is the third person of the Trinity, the 'Triune God' manifested as Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, each Person being God.

According to Catholic Tradition, the Holy Spirit brings us seven gifts. These are wisdom, understanding, counsel, fortitude, knowledge, piety, and fear of God. 'Fear of God' sounds quite scary, but what it means is to revere God and avoid separating ourselves from Him.

According to St. Thomas Aquinas, these gifts, known as grace, are provided by God as supernatural 'helps' for us. They help us to go beyond the limitations of human reason and human nature and to participate in the very life of God, as Christ promised. In other words, they are necessary for our salvation, something that we cannot achieve on our own.

We all need the grace that the Holy Spirit offers us. The grace of the Holy Spirit is for everyone. Through works of charity and prayer we can unlock the power of the seven gifts. This is what the Church is expecting from each of us.

Could you serve the Church and our Parish as a Foundation Governor in one of our Schools?

What are foundation governors?

Foundation Governors are **appointed in the name of the Archbishop and form the majority of the governing body of a Catholic school**. They have a legal duty to preserve and develop the Catholic character of the school and to ensure that the school is conducted in accordance with its trust deed.

Service as a foundation governor in a Catholic school is one of the most significant and important ways members of the Catholic Faith community can support the Church's divine mission of helping all to arrive at the fullness of Christian life.

There are few specific requirements. A Foundation Governor must:

- Be a Catholic who attends Sunday Mass regularly and gives true witness to the teachings of the Church
- Be prepared to work with discretion as a member of the full governing body and attend training events to help build up a body of knowledge and expertise
- Bring a wider skill set to enhance the wider Governing Body in undertaking its collective duties to lead the school and meet the contemporary requirements of the Department for Education and Ofsted.

We need Foundation Governors across all our parish schools; do you have skills that you could bring to the Governing Body of the school? If you want to know more, please contact Fr. Mark either in person or e-mail him at m.moran@rcaol.org.uk
