

## What did Evacuee Boys and Girls have to put into their suitcase?


This list of clothes for Evacuee boys and girls was sent to every family in a city by the British Government. The list told families what to pack in their childrens' suitcases if they were going to be evacuated. This was meant to show the **minimum** amount of different clothes to pack. However, many families from the cities were very poor and so their children's suitcases often contained very few of these clothing items.

## What would a Child Evacuee put into their suitcase when they were going to be evacuated?

- You are going to make a poster showing what things a child evacuee would put into their evacuation suitcase and what things they would not put in the suitcase.
- Look carefully at the images and identify what they are and what they might be made of.
- Decide if that thing was essential and would definitely have to go in the suitcase - or if the child could choose to put in their suitcase
  - or if they would not be able to put that thing in their suitcase.

Chosen Items

Unsuitable Items
