Reflection

I was contacted by one of the staff at the Apostolic Nunciature in Wimbledon on 27 June and invited to an appointment with the Apostolic Nuncio, Archbishop Claudio Gugerotti, the following afternoon. I went online and booked a ticket for the 12.03 train to London from Runcorn. Not being familiar with the London Underground, I got a taxi to the Nunciature, which is on the edge of Wimbledon Common, not too far from where the tennis championship is being played. I was warmly welcomed by a priest who it turned out had spent four years as a curate of a classmate of mine in a parish in Leeds. When the Nuncio came into the room, he greeted me warmly and said that the reason for the invitation was to ask me if I would accept the appointment by His Holiness Pope Francis to be an auxiliary bishop in our Archdiocese. I was taken by surprise because it is only 10 months since I moved to Widnes. I did not sleep very well the night before wondering why I had been asked to attend the appointment with the Apostolic Nuncio. They say that a drowning man sees his life flash before him. Those moments after the nuncio spoke were a bit like that! We chatted for about half an hour and then I accepted the appointment. The appointment was not announced until last Tuesday so the few that needed to know had to keep the news to themselves for over a week. Since the appointment was announced I have been touched by the kind words that I have received from parishioners, brother priests, my family, and friends.

Please pray for me as I prepare for my ordination on 3 September in the Metropolitan Cathedral, Liverpool.
