## Pacem in Terris

Many of you will remember Pope Saint John XXIII, who convened the Second Vatican Council. One of his finest gifts to the Church was his 1963 encyclical, *Pacem in Terris* (Peace on Earth). In it, the saintly Pope made a plea for peace, directed to “*all people of goodwill*”, a plea in itself unique, as most encyclicals are directed only to Catholics. It was a response to the horrors of the 20th century and the more contemporaneous events of the Cold War and the Cuban Missile Crisis. It is often described as Pope John’s “*last will and testament*”, written just two months before his death, while suffering from cancer.

I commend this document to you all (available on the Vatican website). Among many things, the document endorses the dignity of every human being, created in the image and likeness of God, with free will. Because of this, every person has fundamental rights and fundamental duties. In other words, we all have the right to thrive and the duty to help others thrive. All human beings have a right to life. Pope John wrote that claiming one’s rights while ignoring another person’s, “*is like building a house with one hand and tearing it down with the other.*”

While the world is in so much disarray, may we all bear this simple but profound teaching in mind. Furthermore, Pope John began the document by declaring, “*Peace on Earth—which man throughout the ages has so longed for and sought after—can never be established, never guaranteed, except by the diligent observance of the divinely established order.*” So let us also follow the Lord all the more closely, so that peace, which is God’s gift to us, may come to reign.
