Success criteria for a flashback story

- I have used the present tense in my opening paragraph
- I have used the past tense to tell the flashback part of my story
- I have used the present tense to show the reader my flashback part is over
- I have used powerful verbs, adverbs and adjectives
- I have used reference to my senses e.g. touch, smell, taste
- I have used something that happened in the past that shows now e.g. a fear of going into a box again
- I have used lots of language showing emotions and feelings
- I have used perfect speech punctuation using a range of synonyms for said e.g. whispered, muttered, groaned...
- I have used a range of punctuation !? ();,.
