Psalm Response

'Cry out with joy to God, all the earth'

Ora et Labora

Next Friday, we will venerate St. Benedict, Abbot and Co-Patron of Europe. Benedict was born around 480, in Norcia, Umbria (modern day Italy) and is famed for his monastic rule, still followed by many monks and nuns.

The rule can be summarised as; 'ora et labora' (prayer and work). Anyone following the rule must seek to balance these two complimentary concepts. The challenge is to at once be in frequent dialogue with the Lord in prayer and also apply oneself to the happenings of life, and the rule provides a framework for this. I remember hearing one monk say; "Benedict's rule has lasted so long because it is so human". This is certainly true. The rule has truly stood the test of time, precisely because it works, because it is balanced.

So for a follower of Benedict, the day should be pierced with moments of prayer. The Lord is the priority. Indeed, Benedict said; "prefer absolutely nothing to the love of Christ". The prayer of a monk or nun consists of the Divine Office (Liturgy of the Hours), of which Benedict remarked, highlighting its primacy; "nothing whatever in the monastery is to be preferred to it". Typically, a monk or nun will be in church around seven times a day.

Flowing from the 'ora' comes the 'labora'. This could involve; craftwork, teaching, parish work, writing, studying, music and anything related to general upkeep of the monastery. In England, the major 'labora' of the Benedictines until recently was the running of parishes and schools. This is changing. Life can be challenging. Balancing prayer and work might help us to stand up to the challenge of life. So let us follow Benedict's example and seek balance in our lives, through prayer and work.

Archbishop John Sherrington – The Pallium

On the Solemnity of SS. Peter and Paul, Archbishop John received the Pallium from Pope Leo XIV at St. Peter's in the Vatican. The pallium is made of pure white wool and is worn across Archbishop John's shoulders, and it evokes the carrying of the sick, the lost and the wounded sheep. In receiving and wearing it, Archbishop John visibly embraces his role as the shepherd who leads not from above, but from among his flock. The Pallium is a visible theology, a wearable Gospel. We hold Archbishop John in our daily prayers.
