Reflection.

From Monday of last week, the Church's Liturgical Calendar moved into 'Ordinary Time'. The high point of the celebration of the birth of our Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ, and his revelation as the 'Light of the Nations', gives way to the ordinariness of human life. The next peak will be the journey we make following the Lord through Lent, to Easter and to Pentecost. None of us could say that we are living in ordinary times! The reality of the presence of the corona virus means that this is no 'ordinary time'. We are called to be alert and to be on our guard to protect ourselves and others from contagion.

The scripture readings today are an invitation to us to be on the alert to the voice of the Lord in the time and the place we find ourselves. If someone had said to me 12 months ago that I would be living in St Wilfrid's Parish, working with Bishop John, Fr Bill, Fr Carl, and Fr Mark, I think I would be forgiven for doubting them. Samuel was only a boy when he heard the Lord calling him to be a prophet to the people of Israel. John the Baptist points the way to the Lord, to two of his disciples. They become followers of Christ after spending the late afternoon and evening hours with him.

As each day in this extraordinary time unfolds may we have an ear for the Lord, who is present within us, and be alert to the signs inviting us to follow in him.
