Is there one you like the look of which you could attempt to make? <i>Challenge: can you convert the measurements from imperial to metric units?</i>	Design a poster on 2D shapes, listing their properties.	Find out about the role of women during the war. Present your findings in a creative way.	What was make do and mend? Can you find something to make yourself? There are lots of ideas out there on how to turn socks into toys.
