Thinking About Death

In the Funeral Service, one of the optional prayers at the graveside or in the crematorium says: Lord God,, keep us mindful that life is short and the hour of death unknown.

For years, every time I prayed that prayer, I said to myself: I really must make a Will.

And in later years added: And appoint attorneys for health and finance. I arrived in Widnes without having done either, and that fact was very much on my mind and distorted my thinking about dying.

The Archbishop at some stage very sensibly asked me about my funeral wishes. As former bishop of Hallam there is a place for me in the crypt of the Cathedral in Sheffield. That question forced me to make a will and appoint Attorneys. Fortunately, I have lots of nieces and nephews and I corralled four of them so that I have backups!

But just having done those two things, which I should have done years ago, radically changed the way in which I am able to think about my own death, without the intrusion of worrying about what chaos I might leave behind.

With our growing awareness of the consequences of dementia, the appointment of Attorneys is so important, for our own sakes as well as the sake of the family, appointing people who know our mind on health issues as well as on financial matters.

And, not least important, on our funeral wishes. For instance, would I want a Requiem Mass at my funeral.

I would!

St Bede's Church: The Next Chapter

At last, after many years, we have reached the stage of appointing an Architect/Surveyor to supervise the restoration of St Bede's. Work will begin at St Bede's in the very near future, and we are busily trying to clear away what needs to be cleared to give the contractors as much help as we can. We are studying the criteria for grants with the local authority, so that the overall cost is kept to a minimum. We are in touch with the Historic Churches Commission and other relevant bodies to ensure that we are not contravening the integral fabric of this sacred space, and we always take professional advice whenever something is restored or moved as we wish to make prudent decisions that honour this historic place of worship. Much work is happening behind the scenes as we try to safeguard St Bede's for future generations.

In the weeks and months ahead, we will all need to be ready to adapt and change; we will have to endure inconveniences and things will not be as they were before. I suggest that we all try to keep focused on the bigger picture and when we see things changing, let us be the voice of positivity and hope and never the voice of complaint that undermines the good that is happening in our midst.

SYNOD ON SYNODALITY

After perhaps the largest attempt at consultation in history, the first session of the 'Synod on Synodality' begins in Rome this Wednesday, 4 October, and will last for three weeks. The second session will take place in October 2024. In his October prayer intention, Pope Francis says, "without prayer, there will be no Synod". So let us join the Church all over the world in asking the Holy Spirit to bless and guide the Synod gathering. LISTENING TO EACH OTHER

This week, the Synod on Synodality began in Rome. All the group sessions begin in the same way that our parish meetings began in preparation for our own Archdiocesan Synod – by listening to each other. Each group member has four minutes to share their thoughts on a particular question. Meanwhile, the other members of the group are asked not to speak or interrupt but to listen attentively as each person speaks. We don't often listen to each other like this. We're often thinking about what we might say in reply or interrupt because we have a different point of view. However, if we believe that the Holy Spirit has been given to every person who is baptised, we can miss what the Holy Spirit is saying if we fail to listen to each other. This attentive listening to each other is a hallmark of synodality.
